#### Impact and 'take up' of extra-curricular or enrichment activities

This section measures the take up and impact of our provision in providing encouragement and financial support, where necessary, to make sure that Pupil Premium children are able to access all of the opportunities both in school and extra -curricular.

Bright Start Club / Active Breakfast Club: This breakfast provision has altered this year to include coaching and sporting activities before school, as well as a substantial breakfast offer, from a sports company as well as staff from our school. This provision also offers social and team building skills opportunities for the children who attend. All Pupil Premium children who attend our school are offered this for free from reception to year 2. Up until we closed on March 20<sup>th</sup> due to Coronavirus, this offer saw approximately 75% of its participants coming from the Pupil Premium group in school, mostly through the Year One cohort. We saw a difference in the children's behaviour for learning which we, in part, associate with the impact of a healthy breakfast, sporting activities and team building skills from the pre-school sessions.

Educational Visits, Visitors and Workshops: All educational trips, workshops and in school visits that were able to run prior to the closure of schools on March 20<sup>th</sup> were fully attended by Pupil Premium children. These sessions were linked to the curriculum, demonstrating how skills and knowledge gained at school can be applied to the wider world. The school actively pursues parents who have not signed permission slips and part-funded or fully funded educational visits.

Forest School: The school has Forest School equipment which can be used by Pupil Premium children e.g. Wellington boots and waterproof jackets so that all children can access this activity as part of the curriculum. Again all Pupil Premium children have accessed this and engagement is high.
